

is a readable and entertaining shortcourse for ordinary citizens, non-experts who want to participate in the national conversations about the challenges and opportunities generated by the arrival


in Canada of so many newcomers.

The characters in these twelve contrived discussions discover a uniquely Canadian *modus-vivendi* that keeps us negotiating and accommodating rather than deciding and excluding. They propose an updating of the model in order to keep the file on the identity question open and active and to ensure continued debate about <u>who we think we are</u>. Can we hold it all together while they talk about it?

Selected ideas from this book:

- Good conversation should never be hurried and when it is about designing or defining a nation, it is particularly important that debate be allowed to move along at its own pace. One key notion that you will encounter throughout these discussions is a reminder that democracy is a never-ending negotiation... or, as the characters frequently remind each other, the file never closes. ...
- The virtual citizens that you meet in "Who do we think we are?" contend that one of the really unique characteristics of Canadians is their national "passion for bronze". But despite our
- "mediocre" efforts, the UN says we're the best country to live in!
- How sustainable is the community of Canadians in the face of ever-increasing demands for accommodating "non-compliant" newcomers?
- Making it obligatory for host citizens to accommodate newcomers "unreasonably", can be just as perilous to peaceful coexistence as obliging newcomers to "unreasonably" assimilate into the prevailing host identity profile.

Gilles Paquet has published a large number of books and scholarly articles on governance. He has been Dean of the Faculty of Graduate Studies and Research at Carleton University and Dean of the School of Management at the University of Ottawa. Currently, he is Professor Emeritus, associated with the Centre on Governance and the Graduate School of Public and International Affairs at the University of Ottawa. He is a senior partner in Invenire and is editor-in-chief of the publication www.optimumonline.ca, specializing in governance issues.

Selected ideas from this book:

The introduction provides some explanation of the reasons why the conventional ways of thinking are not as useful as they used to be, why a different way of thinking is required, and what the foundations of this new way of thinking are. The key notions of process, design, and reflexivity are showcased.

Paquet underlines two preliminary steps taken in the 1970s to use systems thinking in the analysis of the socio-economy as instituted process: (a) a shift of policy analyses from a focus on goals and control to a focus on intelligence and innovation; and (b) the probing of the socio-economy as instituted process through an analysis of subprocesses (demography, production and exchange,

finance, state, distribution of income and wealth, and ecology of groups and their motives).

He discusses critically some of the key assumptions of the old way of thinking: the omnipresence of state centricity and the myth of shared values; the occlusion of the solidarity sector as an alternative to state and market; and the fixation on the elusive notion of leadership as a result of the assumption that someone has to be in charge.



Petar II Petrović Njegoš, Prince-Bishop (Vladika) of Montenegro from 1830 to 1851, is the Serbian national poet. In Yugoslavia, his principal works, *Mountain Laurel*, *Stephen the Pretender* and *The Light of the Microcosm*, are widely read, performed and quoted — especially *Mountain Laurel*, his best work.


Mountain Laurel is an epic drama set in the bitter wilderness of Montenegro, where towards the close of the 17th century, four or five clans – Serbs who survived the destruction of their medieval kingdom – struggle to escape subjugation and to keep alive the spark of freedom and ferment of their nationhood.

It is a heroic, almost Homeric, society and in this harsh environment, men are warriors and their life is measured only by their manliness and glory in battle. In such circumstances, weaker Serbs supporting the invading Turks are given short shrift. *Mountain Laurel* describes the agonizing decision of the Serbs of the day to massacre traitors in their midst. But *Mountain Laurel* is more than an epic drama or a heroic poem; it is a treasure house of folk wisdom, rough humour, a search for life with honour and an ode

to national survival. 
Kosovo: The Song of the Serbs, by D. Mrkich




DEMS at War!

DEMS. (Defensively Equipped Merchant Ships) and the Battle of Atlantic 1939-1945, by Max Reid. Canada's merchant seamen (and they were all men) served in on of the longest, most dangerous and least appreciated of the services. DEMS seamen were denied veterans benefits for 50 years after the war. Many spent long terms as prisoners of war and DEMS suffered one of the highest casualty rates. Illustrations, and photos, appendices with selections from the DEMS handbook. This is the most authoritative, credible book on this little-known chapter of Canada's history in World War II.

Max Reid joined the Royal Canadian Navy Volunteer Reserve from North Bay, Ontario in early 1943. After training as a Seaman Gunner DEMS he served in the SS PRINCESS JOAN, SS BEATON PARK, SS DUNLOP PARK and the Norwegian freighter MV RIO BRANCO. At the end of the war he was a Leading Seaman/Gunlayer DEMS and transferred to the regular navy. In 1949 he was commissioned from the rank of Petty Officer and subsequently special-

ized in anti-submarine warfare. During his regular navy career he served in nine Canadian warships, including command of H.M.C. Ships LANARK and TERRA NOVA. He retired in 1974, but remained in the Naval Reserve as a Convoy Commodore. Captain (N) (R) Reid is an Officer of the Order of Military Merit and holds the Canada Defense Medal with three Clasps, Victory Medal, Canadian Volunteer Service Medal and Stars for the Battle of the Atlantic, Pacific, Burma and 1939 to 1945.
